Aitutaki Island was identified as the project site through the Secretariat of Pacific Communities (SPC) selection process for the Cook Islands. In keeping with the scope of work assigned for the University of the South Pacific (USP), our project component will focus on building and strengthening the capacity of local government and community stakeholders.

Government Ministry Consultations

At the inception phase of the project, consultations were held with relevant stakeholders. SPC, the Climate Change Division of the Office of the Prime Minister, the Office of Pa Enua/Island Governments, Cook Islands Tertiary Training Institute, the Cook Islands National Council of Women, the Aitutaki Island Council, and executive team of the Aitutaki Island Government to ensure that the USP activities are aligned with existing and upcoming plans and programs of these ministries/departments and community groups. The exercise encouraged buy-in and participation.

All officials and informal agencies met tendered their commitment to the project.

Desktop Review

The desktop review aimed at providing a snapshot of the status of resilience and climate change planning and management capacity in the island community and within the Island Government/Council structures.

The outcome of the review provided an outline to implement the Participatory Needs Assessment (PNA). Stakeholder consultations were completed in 2020 and were reviewed by the island community and leaders earlier this year.

Local Development Plans/Island Strategic Development Plans

The most recent community development plan for Aitutaki remains the 2011 plan.

In recent times, Cook Islands Investment Corporation (CIIC) commissioned an infrastructure plan. The plan reiterated the deterioration of lagoon health and water supply quality for drinking in Aitutaki. It highlighted that tourism development was restricting coastal access and low coordination of planning and coordination efforts. The plan also noted the lack of local people with appropriate qualifications and experience and limited higher education pathway opportunities.

In the upcoming months, the project will work with the Pa Enua/Island Government Unit and the Emergency Management Unit to develop their next community sustainable island development plan to integrate climate change planning and DRM into the plan.







Challenges and Solutions

The key challenge has been maintaining a working rapport with the island leaders and community and working with Suva to provide outputs aligned with expectations.
