

Criteria for selection of households in Nauru for the Global Climate Change Alliance Plus – Scaling Up Pacific Adaptation (GCCA+ SUPA) Project

Activity: GCCA+ SUPA Project purchases and installs water storage tanks, concrete bases and taps only.

Level 1 Screening

Occupied houses with no tank. A tank is defined as having a capacity of more than 5,000 litres. Based on census data and on-the ground-checks.		New tank becomes the property of the house owner

Level 2 Screening

Occupied houses with only one tank A tank is defined as having a capacity of more than 5,000 litres. Based on census data and on-the-ground checks.		New tank becomes the property of the house owner

a. Number of occupants in the house

Once the list is prepared and approved by Cabinet, signed agreements will be established between Department of Climate Change & National Resilience and each household, covering the placement of the tank and the concrete base, the size and type of tank, the ownership of the tank and the responsibility for maintenance.
