Light Note Brochure	The Pacific tailored methodology examines the desired, measurable impact of past efforts and building the first database on impacts hence enable countries to monitor climate actions; traceability on key result areas of adaptation with most vulnerable people, communities, areas; health and well-being, food- water security; ecosystem and ecosystem services; infrastructure and built environment. Light version of the methodology is determined by required skills set and effort level with resources to plan and conduct an impact analysis of the focus interventions.
5 minutes clip	<b>Palau: Institutionalization of the Impact Assessment Methodology &amp; use of Impact Indicators</b> Video highlights efforts geared towards building resiliency and how different agencies learn and view the potential of the methodology to enhance their programme of work at national and state level. 10 minutes	<b>Tonga: public polling during national climate change awareness week “Building a resilient Tonga”</b> Presents on results of public poll with tailored questions from impact methodology, gauging youth- students’ perspectives, their awareness of climate change science in a nutshell, preparedness and information dissemination
6 minutes clip	<b>Cook Islands: Strong advocacy on importance of Ra’ui by traditional leaders</b> Link: Refer to shared folder (Cook islands Clip) Video highlights the important role of traditional leadership and the <i>mana of ra’ui</i> . A case of local indigenous knowledge contributing to tangible on-the-ground actions by the <i>Pa Enuu</i> , Mangaia and reflections from the training on the light version tools of the impact methodology.
10 minutes	Visual Facilitator: Desiree of Tofu Creatives <b>Gendered dimensions with what the data tells us.</b> For any intervention reported, data is mainly on breakdown of participation for men and women who attended training, workshop activities during cycle of implementation. Lack of in-depth reporting of the gender roles we see played by women and men in the target communities; trace how needs are met with improved user access to either a service, facility or resource and counted as direct beneficiary of an intervention(s). For instance, water-sanitation-hygiene WASH needs are gendered because the differences stem both from biological bodies as well as the norms, expectations and taboos surrounding them. With water security measures, increasing community access to water supply through the provision of tanks is more than about its distribution to households and community halls.

<p><b>5 minutes</b> <b>10 minutes</b></p>	<p>Disaggregating data is important to identifying the vulnerable groups and real patterns of where resources are spent; ensure resources are spent on the areas and people most needing the support and can have the biggest impact. Thus, ensuring that the people with special needs, elderly, single mother homes are reflected in the reporting of data disaggregated.</p>
